

### Summary

Google's 2 factor authentication is an effective way to secure online accounts, by getting another code via text message (SMS), phone call, or Google Authenticator app. A new option namely "**Google Prompt**" is also available.



**Google Prompt** - whenever you go to sign in somewhere new with your Google account, you will be prompted a notification via your mobile to confirm. By simply tapping the prompt, you can sign in more quickly rather than inputting 6 digit codes.





## How to setup your phone?

Steps	Details
<p>1. For iOS user to use Google Prompt, you need to install an App namely "Google".</p> <p>Go to App store, search "Google".</p> <p>Install the "Google" app.</p> <p>*The app is built-in on Android phone with updated <a href="#">Google Play services</a>.</p>	 <p>The screenshot shows a search for 'google' on an iPhone. 



3.	<p>Go to My Account. Click icon at upper right hand corner of browser. Then select <b>My Account</b>.</p>										
4.	<p>The Page shows several parts of account settings, click <b>Sign-in &amp; security</b>.</p>										
5.	<p>Select <b>2-Step Verification</b>.</p>	<p>Password &amp; sign-in method</p> <p>Your password protects your account. You can also add a second layer of protection with 2-Step Verification, which sends a single-use code to your phone for you to enter when you sign in. 



6.	In "Set up alternative second step" > Google prompt  Select <b>ADD PHONE</b> .	 <p>Set up alternative second step</p> <p>Set up at least one backup option so that you can still sign in if you don't have your phone with you.</p> <p><b>Google prompt</b> Get a Google prompt on your phone and just tap Yes to sign in.</p> <p><b>ADD PHONE</b></p> <p><b>Security Key</b> A Security Key is a small physical device used for signing in. It plugs into your computer's USB port. <a href="#">Learn more</a></p> <p><b>ADD SECURITY KEY</b></p>
7.	Select <b>GET STARTED</b> .	 <p>Get a Google prompt to sign in</p> <p>Instead of typing verification codes, get a prompt on your phone and just tap Yes to sign in</p> <p><b>CANCEL</b> <b>GET STARTED</b></p>



<p>8. If you signed in to your Google Account on an Android phone or iPhone 5S or later, it shows your mobile model.</p> <p>Or, you can select "Use a different phone" to change to another smartphone.</p> <p>Then, click <b>NEXT</b>.</p> <p>*Screen lock: <b>Android:</b> If there isn't a check next to "Screen lock," select <b>Add a screen lock</b> and follow the onscreen instructions. <b>iPhone:</b> If there isn't a check next to "Touch ID," select <b>How to set it up</b> and follow the onscreen instructions.</p>	 <p>The screenshot shows the 'Add phone' screen.
